


Quality care first

- **Communication** focuses on mutual understanding and paying attention to verbal and nonverbal messages.




- **Responsiveness** focuses on acknowledging patients with care, courtesy and respect.

This technology is offered at two Commonwealth Health affiliate hospitals: Wilkes-Barre General Hospital and Regional Hospital of Scranton.




